BYELAWS

made by Fareham Borough Council under Section 164 of the Public Health Act 1875 and Sections 12 and 15 of the Open Spaces Act 1906 with respect to pleasure grounds, open spaces and recreation grounds in the Borough of Fareham.

The series of byelaws made under Section 164 of the Public Health Act 1875 and Sections 12 and 15 of the Open Spaces Act 1906 with respect to pleasure grounds by the Fareham Borough Council on 28th May, 1975 and confirmed by the Secretary of State on 5th August, 1975 are hereby extended, and amended as follows:

- 1. The aforesaid series of byelaws shall be extended to apply to the grounds known as:-
 - Cawtes and Winnards Copse, Sarisbury which name shall be listed in Schedule I of the aforesaid byelaws.
 - Red Barn Estate, Portchester which name shall be listed in Schedule II of the aforesaid byelaws.
- 2. Byelaw 17 of the aforesaid series of byelaws shall be amended to read:

A person shall not except in the exercise of any lawful right or privilege ride or lead any horse in the pleasure ground

Provided that this byelaw shall not be deemed to prohibit horse riding in any part of the pleasure grounds known as Cawtes and Winnards Copse and Red Barn Estate which by a notice fixed in a conspicuous position has been set apart by the Council as a place where horse riding is permitted.
