

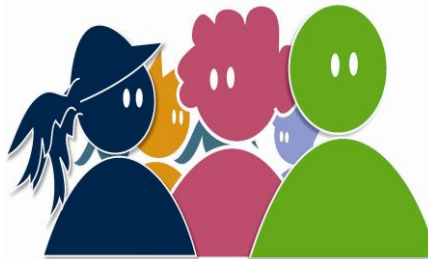

What was talked about?

Local Police update – Sgt. Jerry Tremellen

- Anti-social behaviour down 7%
- Violent crime down by 37%
- Acquisitive crime increased by 12%
- All crime reduced by 14%
- Theft from vehicles a problem, most of the time its insecurities
- Cycle operations Gosport Road & Highlands Road

Q: Anti-social behaviour – drinking in the street, pub at Quay we've complained about. They are sheltering in the subway tunnel. People feel scared.

A: Probably need to look in the evening

Q: It's in the morning

A: Were working with Fareham Borough Council community safety team. They are hiding alcohol in soft drink bottles. Keep letting us know when they are there.

Q: Cllr Davies - Most deprived ward in Fareham, 47% do not have a car. How can they get to surgeries?

A: Speak to the team. We did hold one in the hub but held poor attendance.

Q: Emails - if you get one with positive criminal intent do you want them?

A: Depends on the content, some are fraud or could be threatening which would go to us.

Dr Koyih Tan – Fareham and Gosport Clinical Commissioning Group

Clinical Commissioning Groups (CCGs) are groups of GPs that are responsible for 'commissioning' (planning, designing and procuring) the following health and care services:

- Regular planned hospital care
- Urgent and emergency care in hospital and from out of hours providers
- Community health services
- Mental health and learning disability services

Q: Community nurses – my wife is ill so I have a lot of contact with them. I've found the out of hours service better than the in hours service. In hours nurses are often late with short appointments, poor customer service and not enough staff. What is being done about it?

A: Good question. We used to be able to ask the nurses to go out to appointments which were expensive, now we have a pool of nurses Portchester to Fareham Town with 7 nurses covering. We have to ask if that's enough. We are looking at it and hope GP's will work with the community nurses better.

Q: Cllr P Bryant – Does remit include making appointments at GP surgeries?

A: No but if GP practice is not performing we would be asked to support it. (Access if part of performing) We have to change, but demand is getting higher.

We know it's not ideal, if you have problems getting an appointment speak to your practice manager.

Susie Higgs – Fareham Park Purse feedback and video

Great community spirit in Fareham Park, we won have your say funding of £17,500 and 15 bids came in. We set up a fun day and voting event, 300 votes. 10 projects received money, 5 are here today.

Tony West – Military Mentors

- Work with young people
- Course with fareport training
- We are there to get people into the forces
- 26 students

Fareham Park put together a course for pupils of Henry Cort School next Tuesday running till Christmas. Military ethos teamwork, healthy eating and give young people prizes at the end.

Darren Cramblin – Express FM

- Work with local young people
- Offering 2 day workshops
- People can record their CVs
- Confidence building workshops
- Improve your area workshops
- Provide the info to FBC to see what young people want

Jon Webster – South Coast Choi Kwang Do

- Modern martial arts
- Self-defence & enhancement

St Columba Academy –

- Afterschool classes
- Hour class
- Train before school

The exercise gets young brains working and prepares them for their school day and learning. We work with 20 handpicked children. They have to earn the right to wear the uniform. Teachers and parents completed. Questionnaire on their behaviour, they all improved. We give all the children a grading from the national master. Grant we had is worth £1million.

Andy Kennedy – Y services

- Small local charity, want to deliver local projects
- Running 13 projects and engage with 400 young people a week
- Try and get young people interested in their area
- Set up early evening sport and football coaching on Mondays
- Will run a youth club on Friday evenings, both start after half term

Sarah Kingston – Oak Meadow Children’s Centre

- Play sessions for families
- 2 projects
- Buy sessions of the jungle bus for growing places nursery
- 16 week day sessions and 3 over the weekend
- Outdoor playworker on Saturdays – bear hunts, nature trails to get the children outside
